

# Parkwood Primary School Art and Design Curriculum 2023/24

# All pupils:

- Produce creative work, exploring their ideas and recording their experiences
- · Become proficient in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques
- Evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft and design
- Know about great artists, craft makers and designers, and understand the historical and cultural development of their art forms

Our children use the work of great artists to discuss the following questions:

- What is art?
- Why do people make art?
- How do people talk about art?

Our children will work like artists by using the following element of art:

- **Colour:** artists use colour to express themselves and make the audience feel something specific
- **Form:** three-dimensional objects
- Line: a mark made on a surface that joins different points
- **Shape:** a flat area surrounded by edges or an outline
- **Space:** shows what is there and what isn't there
- Texture: look and feel of a surface
- Pattern: shapes, lines or form repeated
